## **Firearms Licensing**

## New Applications Will Be Processed by Appointment Only

### **Class A License to Carry**

- Applicant must be 21 years of age, must have acceptable form of I.D. such as Driver's License, or other Photo ID or Birth Certificate
- Applicant must have completed and signed application
- Applicant must provide proof of residency in the Town of Hull
- Applicant must be a U.S citizen
- If applicant is a Naturalized Citizen, please bring original Naturalization Document
- NO felony convictions
- NO convictions for Drug Offenses
- NO convictions for Violent Crime
- NO misdemeanor convictions if crime is punishable by more than two years incarceration
- NO Mental Health impairment
- Must provide <u>original</u> Massachusetts Firearms Safety certificate

### **Firearms Identification Cards**

- Applicant must be 18 years of age with acceptable form of I.D.
- If Applicant is between the ages of 15 and 18, a Letter of Consent, signed by a parent or guardian, must be furnished
- Applicant must have completed and signed application
- Applicant must provide proof of residency in the Town of Hull
- Applicant must be a U.S. citizen
- If Applicant id a Naturalized Citizen, please bring original Naturalization Document
- No Felony Convictions within past 5 years
- No Drug Convictions within past 5 years
- No conviction for Violent crimes or Drug Trafficking
- No Misdemeanor conviction if crime is punishable by more than 2 years incarceration within past 5 years
- No Mental Health impairment
- Must provide original Massachusetts Firearms Safety certificate or Hunter Safety Certificate
- Certificate not required for Restricted F.I.D.

#### Fees:

- Class A: \$100.00 (cash or check payable to the Town of Hull) (over age 70 renewal is free)
- Firearms Identifications Cards (F.I.D.): Under age 18 is \$25.00
- Firearms Identifications Cards (F.I.D.): \$100.00

Application Fees shall not be prorated or refunded in the case of revocation or denial.

# All Applicants Will be Fingerprinted and Photographed

Failure to provide information or providing false information will result in the denial of the application and if the information is False, the Police Department may seek a Criminal Complaint in the District Court.
